**“Mystery Retina Theater”**

**Synopsis:** This lecture explores retina cases that are subtle or challenging to diagnose, including retinal tumors. Presentations will include spectral domain OCT, fluorescein angiography, and OCT angiography. Other diagnostic tools to discuss include enhanced depth imaging, infrared images, fundus autofluorescence, indocyanine green angiography, electrophysiologic studies, cytology, histopathology, CT and MRI. Audience participation is encouraged. Attendees will gain insight in assessing subtle and

challenging retinal cases. They will also increase their understanding of diagnostic tests and the impact of retina and oncology pathology on vision.
